

#### **BOOK REVIEW**

Dr. Petra DeWitt, author of *Degrees of Allegiance*, will share her research about German-American experiences during the Great War and the war's impact on German-American culture in Missouri. The book won the 2012 Missouri History Book Award. "*Degrees of Allegiance* is a detailed, sophisticated, and convincing account of how wartime expectations pressured Missouri Germans to relinquish the distinctive parts of their culture and the extent to which they actually did so." *Missouri Historical Review*
