


WHAT'S NEW AT THE MUSEUM

PRESERVING OLD FAMILY LETTERS


Old family letters can be a treasure trove of information and are something that should be preserved for any future generations to enjoy. They add to your family story and are important to your family history.

First you should organize your letters. Make sure they are not kept in a shoe box or held together with rubber bands or ribbons.

- Arrange your letters in date order
- Letters by multiple family members could be organized by surname first and then arranged in date order.
- Groups of letters for different events could also be organized by event, i.e. all war letters to gether, all college letters together, etc.
- Most important is finding a system that works for you and being consistent in your methods throughout the process of organization.

After organization comes preservation.

- Remove the letters from their envelopes and flatten them. Be careful to keep all letters with their envelopes.
- Encapsulate letters & their respective envelopes in acid free, lignin free document sleeves. These sleeves can be Mylar, Polyester or Polypropylene.
- Once the letters are encapsulated they can be placed in archival file folders and then into filing cabinets or 3-ring binders.
