- When reading obituaries, it is helpful to keep calendar software handy. Old obituaries often give death or funeral dates only in relative terms. i.e. John died last Wednesday.
- Collect the obituaries of your ancestors' siblings because they may note which family members preceded the deceased in death, and which were still alive and where they resided.

"William Carl McDonald, 89, passed away on April 2, 2020, at Capital Region Medical Center in Jefferson City. He was born November 15, 1930 near Ulman, Missouri, to William Dwight and Ruby Fay (Helton) McDonald. Following graduation from Tuscumbia High School, he served in the U.S. Air Force for four years. In 1950 he married is high school sweetheart, Ada Maxine Shackleford, who preceded him in death in 2004. After retiring from the FBI in 1987, Carl and Maxine enjoyed traveling around the country.

On January 25, 2009, Carl married his beloved wife, Sue Dillon, who survives at their home in Jefferson City. Together they enjoyed supporting the Tuscumbia Lions basketball teams, serving at the Miller County Historical Society where he was a board member, and a long time elder at Tuscumbia Christian Church and Capital City Christian Church.
